### MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR

**No. 48 (2019)**

**For: PRESIDENTS/HEADS OF UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES, ALL DEANS OF LAW SCHOOLS, CONCERNED LAW STUDENTS, AND OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES**

**Subject: ADVISORY ON CONDITIONALLY ENROLLED STUDENTS IN THE FIRST SEMESTER OF AY 2019-2020 IN RELATION TO THE SEPTEMBER 29, 2019 PHILSAT**

In view of the release of the results of the 6<sup>th</sup> Philippine Law School Admission Test administered on September 29, 2019, the admission/enrollment status of all law students who were conditionally admitted in the First Semester of the Academic Year (AY) 2019-2020 by virtue of a Conditional Enrollment Permit issued by the Legal Education Board (LEB) shall be processed consistent with the following guidelines:

- A. Students with Conditional Enrollment Permit who scored 55% or higher
  1. They shall be treated as regular students beginning in the Second Semester of AY 2019-2020.
- B. Students with Conditional Enrollment Permit who scored at least 45% but below 55%
  1. Law schools issued with Special Government Permits to Admit Examinees Under Discretionary Admission shall treat them as regular students beginning in the Second Semester of AY 2019-2020, subject to the submission of the Discretionary Admission Report pursuant to LEB Memorandum Order (LEBMO) No. 20, Series of 2019. Certificates of Eligibility shall be issued by the LEB to all law students reported by the eligible law schools; and,
  2. Law schools without authority for discretionary admission have the option of either revoking their conditional enrollment at the end of the First Semester and barring them from reenrollment, with full credits for the subjects taken and passed, OR reclassify them as regular students beginning in the Second Semester in the exercise of the discretion given under Section/Paragraph 14 of LEBMO No. 7, Series of 2016, subject to the submission of the Admission Report and Individual Justification required in the same provision. The students reported shall be issued Special Certificates of Eligibility by the LEB.
- C. Students with Conditional Enrollment Permit who scored below 45%
  1. Law schools have the option to either revoking their enrollment at the end of the First Semester and barring them from reenrollment, with full credits for the subjects taken and passed, OR reclassify them as regular students beginning in the Second Semester in the exercise of the discretion given under Section/Paragraph 14 of LEBMO No. 7,

Series of 2016, subject to the submission of the Admission Report and Individual Justification required in the same provision. The students reported shall be issued Special Certificates of Eligibility by the LEB.

**D. Students with Conditional Enrollment Permit who did not take the September 29, 2019 PhiLSAT:**

1. Their conditional admission shall be revoked at the end of the First Semester and barred from reenrollment in the Second Semesters, with full credits for the subjects taken and passed.
