One of the major skills that sets academic law librarians (ALLs) apart from other types of librarians is their knowledge in legal research. To be a legitimate law librarian, ALLs have to know the basic structure of law and the legal research process. They have to master the difference between primary and secondary resources, understand at least the Philippine statutes and constitutions, and acquire skills to convey it to their students and support their clients' research requirements.

However, the recently published article entitled *Legally Bound: Advancing Competencies of Academic Law Librarians in the Philippines* found out that Legal Research is among the competencies that ALLs rated themselves low.
