**Legal Education Board Memorandum Circular  
No. 114, Series of 2022**

**SUBJECT: SUSPENSION OF THE REQUIREMENT OF LEGAL EDUCATION BOARD CERTIFICATION (LEBC) ON BEHALF OF GRADUATES UNDER LEB MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 6 SERIES OF 2017, BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2012-06, AND OF BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2012-02**

In light of the pronouncement of the Honorable Supreme Court on the Motion for Reconsideration dated November 12, 2021 filed by respondents, through the Office of the Solicitor General, in the case of *Pimentel vs. Legal Education Board (LEB), et. al.; and Abayata vs. Hon. Salvador Medialdea, et. al.*, wherein LEB Memorandum Circular (LEBMC) No. 6, LEB Resolution No. 2012-02, and Resolution No. 2012-06 were declared to be invalid insofar as these issuances required law schools to obtain a LEB Certification or LEBC on behalf of their graduates instead of the Special Order issued by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the LEB suspends the aforementioned issuances.

The LEB shall, until further notice, no longer require Legal Education Institutions (LEIs) to secure LEB Certification (LEBC) Numbers for graduating students of law programs. LEB shall instead require LEIs to register their List of Graduates with the LEB for record-keeping purposes only.

Please refer to the attached template for the List of Graduates to be submitted to the LEB within **fifteen (15) days** after the date of graduation.

LEIs who had already graduated students in Academic Years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 but have not yet reported these graduates to the LEB, shall file their List of Graduates therewith **not later than May 31, 2022** using the attached template.
